Progress at Dunrovin

I prepared a piece on Dunrovin, for the summer edition of IWN. It outlined the proposed building and associated site works. I really think that this is a great project for the IWN.



At long last, Dunrovin will be centre stage, the home and HQ for the IWAI.

As can be seen from the drawing and picture, Dunrovin will be a modest building of approximately 2400 sq feet, but still capable of carrying out the functions of a HQ. It will include training facilities, storage for our archives, and two meetings rooms, one capable of taking reasonably large gatherings.

The site itself will be landscaped and the wilderness turned back, it's intended to mainly grass the area, and retain the "woodland" feel to the site. Removal of non-native trees, especially pine will open the site and allow the lower plants and trees to survive and prosper.

The site will also be made secure from entry, as vandalism is always a concern. It is intended to seek permission from Westmeath Co. Co. for use of the car park and to provide a pedestrian access to the site.

Many people may consider that the money is wasted, or that the building will be under utilised, but I for one, do not see merit in these arguments. The building will be an ongoing statement about the Association. Training, meetings, public presentations, home to archives, will all ensure its use and I'm sure in no time, the very existence of the centre will encourage other branches and other uses. I really believe we are starting something positive and forward thinking.
